
### MAKE A PLAN TO VOTE

Voting impacts health & healthcare.

Physician voter turnout rates have historically been lower than those of the general population.

Fewer physicians vote during midterm election years compared to presidential election years.

Physician voter turnout has improved over time. Yet, a significant proportion of physicians still do not vote.\*



This year, ensure you have a plan to vote!



Check your voter registration status & ensure it is up to date.

Know your state's voting requirements & deadlines for:

- Voter registration
- · Requesting an absentee ballot
- Early & mail-in voting





Research who is on your ballot & any ballot measures.

Locate your polling place or ballot return location.



Spread the word & encourage others to make a plan to vote.
